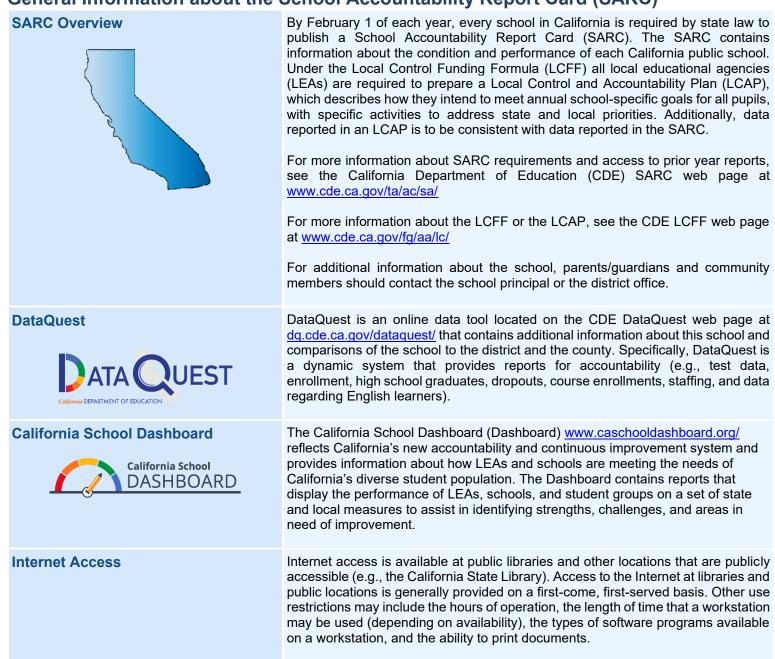

• All training and curriculum development activities at Kit Carson Elementary School revolve rigorous instruction and distance learning. Kit Carson Elementary School has provided professional development training devoted to:Kagan Engagement Strategies Special Education strategies English Learner strategies

Decisions concerning selection of professional development activities are performed by all staff using tools such as teacher input and data analysis to determine the areas in which additional teacher training may enhance classroom instruction and increase student achievement levels. Kit Carson Elementary School supports ongoing professional growth throughout the year on early release days. Teachers meet in both grade level and department level teams to conduct data analysis to identify areas of need. Teaching staff are provided the opportunity to participate in district-sponsored professional development workshops or training session as 1) a supplement to site-based staff development, 2) for reinforcement of or follow-up on previous training, or 3) follow-up training for newly implemented programs/curricula.

Kit Carson Elementary School partners with the English Learner Group to provide professional development and coaching to teachers and administrators in the area of language.

Kit Carson Elementary School offers support to new and veteran teachers through peer coaching, mentoring, and induction. Instructional aides are provided targeted training focused on teaching strategies and curriculum content. All staff are encouraged to attend professional workshops and conferences.
