Concession Stand and Lunch

Lunch will be served 1/2 hour earlier than normal on Friday, December 7th due to the Soccer Tournament we are hosting. The concession stand will be open to all students beginning at 11:50. K-6 are only allowed to purchase from the concession stand once they have eaten lunch. Ice-Cream & Hot Chocolate will still be served as usual. All 7-8 graders have the option to eat lunch in the cafeteria or at the concession stand. As a courtesy to the cafeteria, please remind your student that if they plan on eating from the concession stand that they not order through the cafeteria.

Foggy Day Schedule

Parents and students are encouraged to watch Channel 18, listen to radio stations KMJ and KJUG, or call the school at 582-2843 x109 to hear a recorded message regarding the foggy day bus schedule. Because some areas are clear of fog while other areas are foggy, for safety's sake please delay bringing your child to school if heavy fog persists in your area; even if the school did not call a foggy day. The foggy day schedules are as follows:

PLAN A: Buses are delayed one hour; school starts at 8:20 a.m. Instruction begins at 8:20 a.m. PLAN B: Buses are delayed two hours; school starts at 8:20 a.m. Instruction begins at 8:20 a.m. PLAN C: Bus runs in the morning are canceled; school starts at 8:20 a.m. Instruction begins at 8:20 a.m. PLAN D: Both morning and afternoon bus runs are canceled; school starts at 8:20 a.m. Instruction begins at 8:20 a.m.

When driving the kids to school, please bring them when you feel it is safe for you to drive.

Phone Calls

The office receives many phone calls within minutes of the release bell to get students off the bus, on the bus, out of latchkey, to pick up, permission to go home with another parent. It is very hard to get a hold of students so close to the release bell.

We would appreciate it if your student could bring a note to school for the office or bus drivers. Should something change where a note can not be brought to school, please call the school by 1:00 p.m. so that the proper people are informed in a timely manner.



Classroom Christmas Parties
